CHRISTIAN EXPEDITION

DAY 1: WEDNESDAY, APRIL 9, 2027 | DEPART THE US

Our journey of a lifetime begins with a departure from Cleveland on United. We will be served dinner and breakfast en route.

DAY 2: THURSDAY, APRIL 10, 2027 | ARRIVE IN ISRAEL, CAESAREA BY THE SEA

Upon arrival at Ben Gurion airport, we will be helped through customs and security. We head for Caesarea Maritima, the majestic seaport, built by Herod the Great in honor of Caesar Augustus.* Overnight Tel Aviv area. Carlton or similar. D

**Note: The visit to Caesarea Maritima depends on the flight's arrival time.*

DAY 3: FRIDAY, APRIL 11, 2027 | RAMON CRATER, BEERSHEBA, TIMNA, WILDERNESS TABERNACLE, BORDER CROSSING TO JORDAN

After breakfast we marvel at the Ramon Crater, where we learn about the Wilderness wandering of the ancient Israelites. We proceed to Beersheba, the ancient home of Abraham, to see the ruins and archeological site. After lunch, we head for Timna and the Wilderness Tabernacle before we cross the border from Eilat into Aqaba and head to our hotel for dinner, relaxation and overnight. Overnight Aqaba. Al Manara or similar. B, D.

DAY 4: SATURDAY, APRIL 12, 2027 | PETRA

In the morning, we depart Aqaba and drive to Petra, the ancient Nabatean capital and "Rose Red City half as old as time." We'll see the spectacular "city of the dead," with its famed gorge, ancient streets, temples, dwelling places and tombs carved in solid rock. Our visit includes a two-mile walk through the famous Siq (the natural gorge) to arrive at the Treasury. We can see Roman temple ruins of the Roman city, the Nabatean Judgment Hall, palace tombs, famous Urn Temple and the Roman Amphitheater. A climb of several hundred steps to the "high places" might appeal to the adventurous. We leave Petra and head to the Dead Sea. Overnight at the Dead Sea Marriott Resort & Spa. B, D.

DAY 5: SUNDAY, APRIL 13, 2027 | MOUNT NEBO, BETHANY BEYOND THE JORDAN, DEAD SEA

After breakfast, we move to Mt. Nebo, where Moses stood to view the Promised Land. We then visit the baptismal site where John baptized Jesus at Bethany Beyond the Jordan (John 1:26-28). After lunch we spend the afternoon relaxing at our hotel or floating in the Dead Sea. Optional spa treatments are available at our hotel where we enjoy dinner and overnight. Overnight Dead Sea. Dead Sea Marriott or similar. B, D.

DAY 6: MONDAY, APRIL 14, 2027 | BORDER CROSSING, JERICHO, BAPTISM, BEIT SHEAN

Early in the morning, we cross the King Hussein Bridge into Israel and head for the Tel of Jericho - a favorite spot for archaeologists. We enjoy an excellent view of the Mount of Temptation. Jericho is an excellent location to buy world-famous Hebron pottery. Following a stop for shopping and

lunch, we depart for Gan HaShlosha, near Gideon's Spring, which feeds the Jordan, for our baptism. We conclude the day at the incredible ruins of Beit Shean, featuring eighteen layers of civilization where Saul and his sons were nailed to the city wall (1 Samuel 31:10). Overnight Sea of Galilee area. U Boutique Kinneret or similar. B, D.

DAY 7: TUESDAY, APRIL 15, 2027 | SEA OF GALILEE BOAT RIDE, CAESAREA PHILIPPI, MOUNT OF BEATITUDES, CHORAZIN, CAPERNAUM, MAGDALA

We begin the day with a memorable boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Our bus climbs into the Golan Heights where we arrive at the base of Mt. Hermon. Banyas, the Caesarea Philippi of the Bible, is a main water source for the Jordan River. Here Peter made his great declaration about Jesus (Mk. 8:27ff). After lunch, we follow some of the stories in Mark 4-6 about the ministry of Jesus. Our stops include the Mt. of Beatitudes where Jesus gave the Sermon on the Mount. We move on to Chorazin with its extensive ruins, then Capernaum, our Lord's hometown for two years (Matt. 4:13), and marvel at multitudes that were attracted to the miracles performed by Jesus. We stop at Magdala to see the remnants of a 1st Century synagogue which likely was visited by our Lord. Overnight Sea of Galilee area. U Boutique Kinneret or similar. B, D.



SEA OF GALILEE

DAY 8: WEDNESDAY, APRIL 16, 2027 | MOUNT ARBEL, NAZARETH, MEGIDDO, HOLOCAUST MUSEUM

An early walk along the shore provides a spectacular memory of sunrise over the Sea of Galilee. We begin the day by climbing the path to Mt. Arbel for a farewell to and majestic view of the lake. We turn to Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus, to visit the Church of the Annunciation, experience Nazareth Village, and see archaeological ruins from the 1st Century. We move on to the Tel of Megiddo, the site of one of Joshua's victories, which dates to 4,000 B.C. We look down on the Valley of Armageddon, where this period of world history concludes with the final battle (Revelation 16:16). We conclude the day with a visit to Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Museum, for sobering reminders of the atrocities of the Nazis against the Jews in World War II, before settling into our hotel in Jerusalem. Overnight Jerusalem. Inbal or similar. B, D.

DAY 9: THURSDAY, APRIL 17, 2027 | TEMPLE MOUNT, POOLS OF BETHESDA, PILGRIM'S PATH, JERUSALEM ARCHAEOLOGICAL PARK, SOUTHERN STEPS, WESTERN WALL & WESTERN WALL TUNNEL, TEMPLE INSTITUTE, ISRAEL MUSEUM

We head to the Mt. of Olives for a panoramic view of the Old City. We catch an early bus to the Temple Mount, home to the temples of Solomon and Herod and the current location of the Dome of the Rock, the Mosque of Omar, originally built in the 6th Century, and the Al Aqsa Mosque, used by Muslims for prayer. We visit the Pools of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the lame man (John 5). We walk the Pilgrim's Path and visit the Jerusalem Archaeological Park, walking among Herodian stones and the Southern Steps from the 2nd Temple period. We spend time at the Western Wall and descend into the Western Wall Tunnels for a remarkable look at the ancient

stones beneath the city. We enter the Jewish Quarter to visit the Temple Treasures Institute that reminds us of preparations being made for the construction of the 3rd Temple. In the afternoon we visit the Israel Museum where we find a model of 1st Century Jerusalem. Overnight Jerusalem. Inbal or similar. B, D.



GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE

DAY 10: FRIDAY, APRIL 18, 2027 | EIN GEDI, MASADA, QUMRAN, BETHANY, GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE

We head to the desert and enjoy a stop at Masada, where Jewish zealots met their fate at the hands of the Roman army. We move on to Ein Gedi, the desert oasis where we recall the worship of David in Psalm 63. We visit Qumran, the home of the Essenes and the location for the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls. We then visit Bethany, where Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead (John 11). We conclude the day with a visit to the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus prayed the night before His crucifixion. Overnight Jerusalem. Inbal or similar. B, D.

DAY 11: SATURDAY, APRIL 19, 2027: BETHLEHEM, CHURCH OF THE NATIVITY, SHEPHERD'S FIELDS, HERODIUM, HEBRON, EIN KAREM

We leave Jerusalem and visit Bethlehem's Church of the Nativity, built over the site of our Lord's birth. We visit the Shepherd's Fields and reflect on the appearance of the angels to announce the birth of Christ to the shepherds (Luke 2:8-18). We visit the Herodium, the majestic man-made mountain outside of Bethlehem, where King Herod's grave was recently

discovered. We head to Hebron to visit the Cave of the Patriarchs, the burial site of Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Rebecca, Jacob, and Leah. We conclude the day in the beautiful village of Ein Karem, birthplace of John the Baptist. Overnight Jerusalem. Inbal or similar. B, D.

DAY 12: SUNDAY, APRIL 20, 2027 | GARDEN TOMB, GORDON'S CALVARY, MOUNT OF OLIVES, VIA DOLOROSA, CHURCH OF THE HOLY SEPULCHER, SHOPPING, FAREWELL DINNER

We visit Gordon's Calvary and the Garden Tomb for communion and worship, always a highlight of our tours. We head to the Mt. of Olives for a panoramic view of the Old City of Jerusalem. We enter the Old City through the Lion's Gate and pass through the crowded streets as we follow the "Way of Sorrows," the Via Dolorosa, to Calvary and to the tomb of Christ at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Our afternoon features shopping on David Street or optional visits in the Old City. We gather for our farewell dinner before being transferred to Ben Gurion airport for our late departure home. B, FD.

We arrive back in Cleveland early this morning, returning home filled with life-changing memories of what it was like to walk in the footsteps of Moses and Jesus during our visit to the Holy Land.

CHRISTIAN EXPEDITION TERMS OF SERVICE

Itineraries: Itineraries are prepared and scheduled in advance according to the best information available at the time and are subject to change by the date of the trip.

Pricing: Christian Expedition, Inc. reserves the right to adjust pricing should the following occur; (1) Rise in Airfare due to higher fuel costs, etc. (2) Rise in ground costs due to increases in hotel charges, bus fares, fees, taxes and other costs due to the fluctuating value of the U.S. dollar against foreign currency.

Deposits and final payments: A deposit of \$450.00 per person is required to hold your reservation of which \$200 is non-refundable (may be refundable under travel insurance conditions). Final payment is due 90 days prior to the departure date. Payment can be made by credit card or check.

Cancellation fees: For cancellations received 90 days or more in advance of the trip's original departure date, all monies paid are refundable less \$200 per person. For cancellations received less than 90 days prior to the original departure date (even in the case of postponement), the initial deposit of \$450 plus any non-recoverable expenses associated with your reservation incurred by CE will be non-refundable. These expenses may include, but are not limited to, charges imposed by the airlines, hotels, and bus companies, the cost of labor associated with the servicing of your reservation, and the costs assessed for the use of our reservation system, as determined or estimated by CE.
